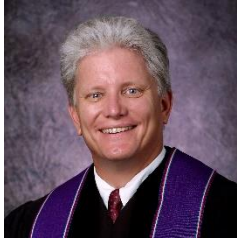


Rev. Dr. Don Flowers

Biography

Rev. Flowers has been the pastor of Providence Baptist Church on Daniel Island, South Carolina, since 1997. Prior to this, he was the Minister of Youth and Activities at First Baptist Church in Greenville, SC. He received his BA in Religion from Wake Forest University in 1980, a Master of Divinity from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1985 and a Doctor of Ministry from Candler School of Theology, Emory University in 2000. While a student at Emory, he focused his work on sexual ethics for parents, which ultimately was the topic of his dissertation.



In the past he has served on the Coordinating Council of the SC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, served with the Trident United Way and serves as a pool chaplain at MUSC Hospital.
