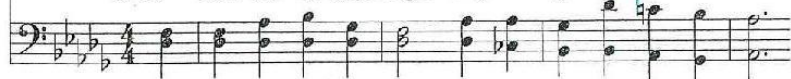

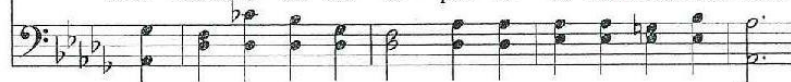
We Call Ourselves Disciples

5. So now the vi-sion bright-ens, the light of Christ burns still



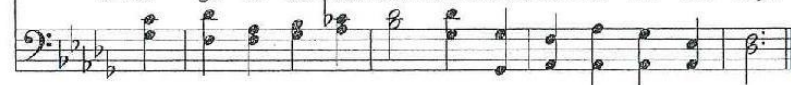
1. We seek the truth in wis - dom, and beau - ty in each day.
