Finance and Stewardship moment

Our committee realizes that not everyone carries cash and cheque books with them anymore. We have options now to make it easier and more convenient for our congregation to give to PWUBC through electronic payment methods. Cheque and cash donations through your church envelopes still work great, but try one of the following if you are savvy with the digital financial services:

Pre-authorized giving.

PWUBC can debit your bank account directly with the amount you choose at the frequency you prefer. You can give \$5, 10, 25, 50 automatically each week, bi-weekly or even monthly. There are PAG sheets available at the foyer desk, or a copy can be emailed to you – just ask Scott (scschofi@dal.ca), Laraine (bjagoe@ns.sympatico.ca) or Cam (cporter3700@yahoo.ca). Fill out a form and return to the treasurer's folder or the church office.

Interac direct e-transfers.

If you like an electronic payment option but want more control on the amount and frequency then consider e-transfers. All online banking institutions have this service available, and most are without any service fee for personal accounts. Follow your banks method for Interac e-transfers from your online banking platform and use these guidelines:

- Use only this email for sending money (donatepwubc@gmail.com) ** do not send to the church office or other individuals **
 - Automatic deposit is setup for this address, but if a security question is request please use this question (What initials for our church?), and the answer (PWUBC) in all caps
 - In the memo section please include your full name and if you want to designate the offering to a specific church fund
- ** If you do not already have a PWUBC envelope registered and want a tax receipt please email separately with address and contact information **

Credit Card payments.

PWUBC offerings can also be received via credit card through the Canada Helps website for registered charities. If you would like to make a receipted donation to our church using your credit card, please find the link on our homepage (pwubc.org) or directly through their website

(<https://www.canadahelps.org/en/dn/11488>). Tax receipts for offerings through Canada Helps are given from their site, and additional ones cannot be printed by PWUBC.

Designate where your funds go.

Financial contributions to the church that do not have a specific fund designated will go towards the general operations of the church. For all of the above options, however, you can designate a portion of the donation towards a specific fund (benevolent, special offering, etc....).
